• 4.1 Welcome

New District Administrator, Joni Giese, introduced herself.

• 4.2 Programs & Projects Update

- Jeff Anderson reported that the water level at Upper Prior Lake is 901.5. The Ferric Chloride structure is operating. So far in 2021 a total of 12,000 pounds of carp have been removed from Spring and Upper Prior Lakes.
- Maggie Karschnia reported that the 5-year Sutton Lake Project has been moving along and is near completion. Some Beaver leveler outlets, site stabilization, and rock grading are in final stages.

4.3 2020 Aquatic Vegetation Survey Results Presentation (Steve McComas)

Steve McComas reported Fish, Spring, Upper and Lower Prior have been showing water quality improvement and Curly Leaf Pond Weed is under control. Many native aquatic plants that consume phosphorous are making a comeback. Curly Leaf Pond Weed starts growing early in the spring, and in the past it has been treated with herbicide to reduce it. Spring Lake now has 14 native plants that are doing well. There is Eurasian Milfoil in Lower Prior Lake but it is not excessive. Manager Hennes asked Steve McComas how well does he think the PLSLWD is doing. Steve McComas stated that the active management of the lakes has them improving steadily and rates the PLSLWD not only good in Minnesota but nationally also.

• 4.4 Upper Watershed Blueprint (Brian Kallio)

- O Brian Kallio reported that it was difficult to get projects that improved both water storage and water quality. The Blueprint indicated the cost and benefit of each project. Funding sources and rating of the projects was also in the report. Many sources of information, history, and data were used for this Upper Watershed Blueprint. It is a goal to complete projects to achieve both water storage and water quality so that alum treatment will be less necessary.
- Manager Hennes moved to approve the Upper Watershed Blueprint. Second by Manager Pany. All Ayes. Passed 4-0.
